Safe Place Ministries exists to provide training, resources, and support to individuals and organizations whose lives and ministries have been touched by domestic abuse, childhood sexual abuse, and sexual assault. By accurately identifying, understanding, and responding to the complex dynamics of abuse, together we can bring hope and healing to individuals, families and communities.

DIRECT CLIENT SERVICES

Located in Boise, Idaho, Safe Place Ministries exists to serve individuals impacted by abuse in all its forms. We offer a variety of services that holistically address client needs from the initial crisis phase, through stabilization and recovery. This year we provided over 1,200 services to approximately 1,125 adult victims including their children. Types of services offered include the following:

- ◆ Assessments and referrals
- ◆ Social Services (clothing, childcare, transportation support, household supplies and personal care items)
- ◆ Advocacy (supporting and accompanying clients through the legal system, mainstream social services and advocating for clients in a variety of circumstances)
- ◆ Case Management (assessing client needs, developing a plan and help with implementation of plan)
- ◆ 1:1 Support (education, mentoring and spiritual care)
- ◆ Educational Support Classes and Trainings

EDUCATION RESOURCE NETWORK

The SPM Education Resource Network exists to support and equip our community to respond with wisdom and compassion to those affected by abuse. The network consists of faith-based and secular organizations that work with individuals from all walks of life. We partner with local service providers including Love Inc., Nampa Family Justice Center, El-Ada Community Action Partnership, Terry Reilly, and the Boise City/Ada County Housing Authority.

In addition, Safe Place Ministries collaborates with churches, ministries, healthcare providers, attorneys, local hospitals, law enforcement, victim witness coordinators, and crisis pregnancy services. This fiscal year SPM distributed over 3,639 resources. We offer the following services through our Education Resource Network:

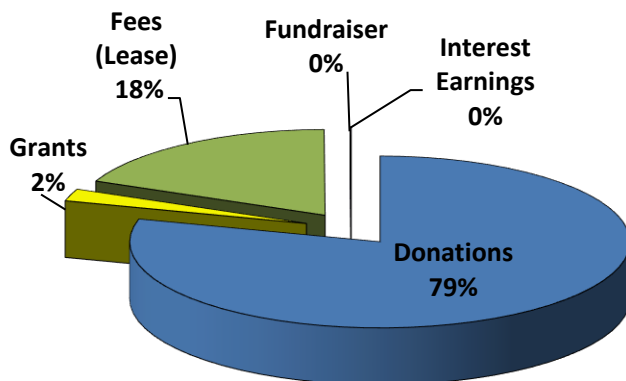
- ◆ Introduction to Domestic Abuse for Church Leaders

HIGHLIGHTS

- ◆ After experiencing multiple leaks and repair issues throughout previous years, we are thankful to report the completion of a much-needed roof replacement for our building.
- ◆ Financially Safe Place Ministries again saw a favorable variance in our budgeted expenses. We were able to decrease our spending by more than 7%. This decrease in our expenses contributed to the ministry ending the year within a 1% difference in our net income.
- ◆ SPM maintained current client service levels despite a slight decrease in our net income during the past fiscal year. In person classes have resumed and we anticipate returning to full class schedules by Fall 2022.
- ◆ We set a goal last year to better track our online resources. This goal was achieved by more than a 22% increase. The consistency of a monthly emailed newsletter helped us obtain this growth as well as share information pertinent to the ministry.
